Hunting Policy - Town of Chilmark October 20, 1998

The following properties may be hunted:

- a. Fulling Mill Brook Preserve
- b. Englander
- c. Chilmark Landfill
- d. Proposed Future Landfill off Middle Line Road
- e. Town Forest
- f. Upper Chilmark Pond/Lucy Vincent Beach Property

All hunting regulations and laws of the commonwealth and the town shall be observed at all times by people using town properties.

Hunting shall only be permitted between October 16th and February 28th of each year. Hunting shall be permitted on a Monday through Saturday basis during "deer week"; hunting shall be permitted on a Tuesday through Saturday basis during all other game seasons. Hunting shall only take place during daylight hunting hours. No hunting is permitted at or near the landfill during LDO operating hours. No Black-powder hunting is allowed on the Fulling Mill or Lucy Vincent Beach property. Animal entrails shall not be left in areas frequented by the public.

Deer, ducks, geese, pheasant, rabbit and raccoon may be hunted on open properties, subject to the restrictions contained in other sections of this policy. No other species may be hunted.

Town properties shall be closed to the public each year during deer week but shall be open to the public during all of the other game seasons.

The town shall erect signs each year at all public accesses to the properties being hunted and at regular intervals around the property boundaries reading "hunting by written permission only" and informing the public of the hunter/non-hunter coexistence policy. During "deer week" additional signs shall be erected notifying the general public that the property is closed entirely.

DEER WEEK

No one shall hunt on town property without a hunting permit issued by the town. There is no charge for this permit. Any person holding a valid Massachusetts hunting or sporting license and an FID card or License-to-carry-firearms is entitled to apply for a town hunting permit.

A town hunting permit for deer week shall specify a hunter's name, address, hunting license number and FID or LTCF number, telephone number, date(s) for which it is valid and vehicle make and license number of vehicle likely to be used during hunting.

A limited number of individual permits will be issued for each hunting date for each property:
